### Answers for Questions, pages 2-3

So he can make a fire (to keep warm).

### Answers for Questions, pages 4-5

and pull?  
It falls (onto the ground).

### Answers for Questions, pages 12-13

- PRE: 1) Look and fill in:  
Jelani ..... the baby elephant.  
Answer: Jelani **hugs** the baby elephant.  
2) Why do you think Jelani does that?  
Because the baby elephant helped him (with the tree/pull  
down the tree).
- POST: Why is Jelani happy? What does he know?  
Because the tree came down. He knows the tree came down  
because of the elephants.

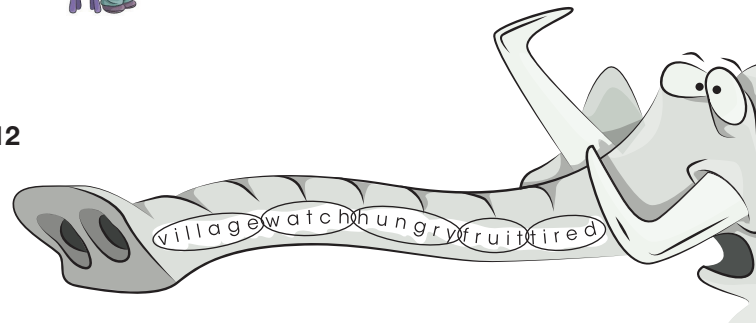

NARRATOR: Three

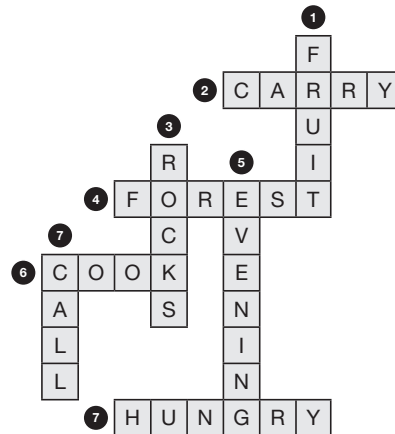
NARRATOR: Jelani picks up his axe and starts chopping again. The baby elephant watches. Jelani works all day, but the tree still stands strong.
