I am ('m) funny. He/She/It is ('s) funny. We/You/They are ('re) funny.

Negative

l am not ('m not) funny. He/She/It is not (isn't) funny. We/You/They are not (aren't) funny.

Interrogative/ **Short answers** Am I funny? Yes, I am. / No, I'm not.

Is he/she/it funny? Yes, he/she/it is. / No, he/she/it isn't.

Are we/you/they funny? Yes, we/you/they are. / No, we/you/they aren't.

Use

- We do not repeat the whole question in short answers. We only use **Yes** or **No**, the **subject** pronoun and the appropriate verb form. Is she here? Yes, she is.
- We use the long form of the verb to be in positive short answers.

Is it big? Yes, it is. (NOT: Yes, it's.)

• We use the **short form** of the verb **to be** in negative short answers.

Is he from Italy? No, he isn't. (NOT: No, he is not.)
