Great UK Walks

A	Hadrian's Wall lies across the border between England and Scotland. Built by the Romans from the 2nd century onwards, the walk along it is 135 kms and stretches from the east coast to the west. It usually takes about six days to trek through the stunning Northern scenery. The trail even passes through an ancient Roman fort at one point.
B	If you love the sea, then walking along the Lizard Peninsula in Cornwall in the south of England is just for you. You can trek along cliffs and through traditional fishing villages. The views of sandy beaches and rugged rocks are spectacular, and you also get the chance to see some rare plants that are only found in this part of the country.
C	Walking the full 300 kms of the Pembrokeshire Coastal Path can be a challenge. The trail, running along the coast of Wales, has lots of steep hills and cliffs that might put off some people. It is said that the distance you walk going up and down the hills here is the same as it takes to climb Everest! Luckily, there are easier sections for less experienced hikers.
